INSTRUCTIONS TO THE APPLICANT

This form must be completely filled out (preferably on a typewriter)

Photographs.—You are required to send with this application three photographs of yourself taken within 30 days of the date of this application. These photographs must be 2 by 2 inches in size and the distance from top of head to point of chin should be approximately 1 1/2 inches. They must not be pasted on cards or mounted in any other way, must be on thin paper, have a light background, and clearly show a front view of your face without hat. Snapshots, prints of full-length portraits will not be accepted. Each of these photographs must be signed by you on the margin and not on its face or the clothing.

Money order.—You must obtain a United States postal money order of the sum of \$1, payable to the order of the "Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D. C." This money order, which is in payment for a new declaration or certificate, must be attached to this application when you send it or take it to the naturalization officer named on the other side of this form.

Execution of this application.—You must sign this application and be sworn to it. The application may be filled in, signed, and sworn to before an officer of the Immigration and Naturalization Service without cost. If executed before a notary public, clerk of court, or other officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes, the seal of the notary, clerk, or other officer must be impressed where indicated.
